- **Integrate a back-up plan.** A battery back-up system ensures the pump is ready to go even if the power fails. Back-ups can also be found with WiFi connectivity to alert homeowners to potential problems or failures with the pump.
- **The location of the home matters.** A home with a low water table or far from bodies of water can get by with a low horsepower pump, but something with a little more power is needed for homes near water or on a floodplain. It is also vital
